

Sports Premium Grant Review



2019-20



The Primary PE and Sports Premium for schools was introduced in 2013. This government funding is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

The school's allocation for 2019-20 was **£17,178**. The focus of our spending was on delivering/meeting the five key indicators:

- Engage all pupils in regular physical activity
- Raise the profile of PE and Sport across the school
- Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE
- Broaden the experiences of sports activities offered to pupils
- Increase participation in competitive sport

Commando Joes (team building skills)	£1,475	Pupils from Rec-Year 6 were able to work with a qualified trainer to complete team focused physical problem solving tasks. Over the 6 week programmes, pupils demonstrated improved skills needed for team activities including communication and tactical thinking.
Equipment Replacement/Renewal	£1,500*	This spend will be carried forward into the next academic year.
External Providers of extra-curricular activities to explore new sports.	£1,600*	This spend will be carried forward into the next academic year.
