Safeguarding Reminders

If parents are not happy with a situation, they need to ring school and make an appointment to speak to the class teacher or a senior leader. Children witnessing this aggression can feel unsafe and some may feel that , because an adult is doing this, it must be okay for them to do it!

Sickness and diarrhoea bugs are making the rounds of schools again. Please remember that children must remain at home for 48 hours after the last bout, just to ensure that they are no longer contagious.
