

# Sports Premium Grant Planned Expenditure (Reviewed)



2024-25



The Primary PE and Sports Premium for schools was introduced in 2013. This government funding is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

The school's estimated allocation for 2024-25 is **£17,180**. The focus of our spending was on the delivery of the five key indicators

- Engage all pupils in regular physical activity
- Raise the profile of PE and Sport across the school
- Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE
- Broaden the experiences of sports activities offered to pupils
- Increase participation in competitive sport

<p>Newcastle United Foundation to deliver:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• a day of PE each Wednesday (providing CPD for staff)</li> <li>• A 60 minute extra-curricular club.</li> <li>• the 'Match Fit' Programme (Healthy Living Focus)</li> <li>• the 'On Side' Programme (PSHE)</li> <li>• access to inter-school festivals</li> <li>• half a day per week to deliver the Commando Joes Programme building Team skills.</li> </ul>	<b>£ 12,750</b>	<p>Non specialist teachers have been able to continue to work alongside NUFC staff to boost their confidence, knowledge and skills in subject delivery.</p> <p>KS1/2 children had access to a range of trainer led sports activities after school.</p> <p>Many of our pupils have SEND with traits of ASD/ADHD and do not cope well in competitive situations which can result in reluctance to participate in PE. Despite this, 97% of children participated in PE lessons every week which covered a range of sports and skills. 100% of children accessed some PE.</p>
<p>Top-up/Extra Swimming Lessons</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To deliver catch up lessons to Year 6 pupils in their final term who have not yet achieved the 25m standard.</li> </ul>	<b>£1,000*</b>	<p><b>This data has not yet been made available by the swimming tuition provider, Active Northumberland at will be added as soon as it is available.</b></p> <p>Year 6 pupils were able to achieve the following outcomes:</p> <p>..... could swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres</p> <p>..... could use a range of strokes effectively, for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke</p> <p>..... could perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situation at stage 2 (face in the water; ability to float unaided; good kicking ability; independent travel in the water).</p>
<p>Equipment Replacement/Renewal</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To ensure that equipment that is lost or damaged is replaced to ensure children have access to quality resources.</li> </ul>	<b>£1,000*</b>	<p>Equipment purchased has gradually been re-introduced to playtimes but this has been a slow process based on school observation that children did not have knowledge of how to use equipment for its intended purpose. Children have had to be specifically instructed in how to use the purchased equipment. This has supported children in being more active during un-structured periods of the day which some pupils struggle with.</p> <p>Playing with equipment collaboratively has improved pupil social skills.</p>
<p>One off purchase of a PE curriculum used by non-specialist staff who are not receiving CPD from NUFC specialist staff.</p>	<b>£1,200</b>	<p>Non-specialist staff are showing increased confidence with the new scheme with a real focus on sequential skills progression.</p>
<p>External Providers of extra-curricular activities to explore new sports.</p>	<b>£1,250*</b>	<p><b>This activity will be carried forward to 2026.</b></p>
