I can write my name using my name card to help me.



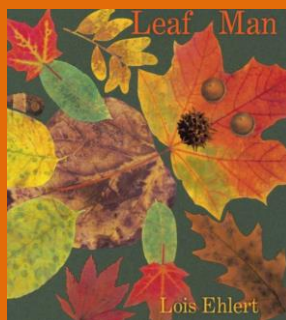
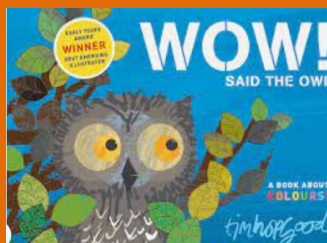
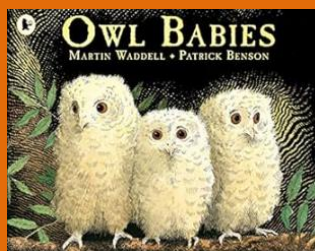
Maths
